FROM STYLIST TO ENTREPRENEUR Kingsport Academy of Hair Design

In January 2016, Angela Braan took a leap of faith and scheduled an appointment with senior business counselor Aundrea Salyer at KOSBE, the Tennessee Small Business Development Center's Kingsport affiliate office.

Braan was a stylist at a local salon but believed she had more potential. With support from KOSBE/TSBDC, she transitioned from employee to entrepreneur, opening Cassia's Salon and Spa just six months later.

In 2018, Braan's commitment to growth led her back to KOSBE/TSBDC, where she refined her business strategy using tools like GrowthWheel and explored ways to expand her enterprise. Through counseling services and continued work on her business plan, she successfully grew her business and explored succession planning options.

This proactive approach helped Braan scale her business and prepare for the future. As her business grew, changes in her personal life made working behind the salon chair more difficult, prompting her to explore new ways to continue her craft.

This exploration led Braan to become the owner of the Kingsport Academy of Hair Design. Located in Kingsport, Tennessee, the academy is a full-service salon designed to offer cosmetology students an environment to learn and hone their skills. This new venture reflects Braan's deep industry expertise and allows her to mentor aspiring cosmetologists, providing them a space to learn and practice under her seasoned guidance.

With more than 25 years of experience, Braan continues to shape the future of cosmetology while ensuring her legacy thrives.

Braan's journey is an inspiring example of perseverance, ambition and community support. Through the guidance of KOSBE/TSBDC, she was able to create a thriving and expanding business.

SOMEBODY'S WATCHING YOU Digital Overwatch

When military veteran and IT security expert Jason Kocienski founded Digital Overwatch, he brought with him years of experience as a Navy Corpsman, Army Reservist in Special Operations, and private military consultant. His company provides cybersecurity and IT services, including Fractional CISO services, managed IT solutions and basic IT support to businesses in need of cloud-based security and mobile support for teams of fifteen or more employees. Despite his extensive technical expertise, Kocienski faced challenges in expanding his client base and implementing effective marketing strategies. Recognizing the need for guidance, he turned to the Tennessee Small Business Development Center (TSBDC) at ETSU for support in business development and growth.

TSBDC counselors worked closely with him to refine his marketing approach, helping him identify his ideal customer and explore various methods to reach them effectively. Through strategic discussions, they provided insights on leveraging direct outreach, digital marketing and networking opportunities to build brand recognition. They also introduced him to valuable resources such as business directories and industry-specific databases to aid in prospecting potential clients.

Additionally, TSBDC emphasized the importance of optimizing Digital Overwatch's online presence. They provided an evaluation of the company's website performance, suggested improvements for search engine visibility and shared tools to enhance digital marketing efforts. The team also encouraged participation in professional development opportunities, such as a LinkedIn Bootcamp, to strengthen networking and engagement with potential customers. To further support growth, TSBDC introduced Kocienski to co-working spaces and networking groups that could offer collaboration and client connections. They also discussed funding options, including SBA microloans, should he seek financial assistance for business expansion in the future.

With the guidance of TSBDC, Digital Overwatch has refined its marketing strategy and developed targeted outreach efforts. The company is now actively working on expanding its client base and strengthening relationships within the industry. Armed with a clearer vision and structured plan, Kocienski is well-positioned to establish Digital Overwatch as a trusted cybersecurity and IT services provider in the region. TSBDC at ETSU remains committed to supporting Digital Overwatch as it continues to grow and thrive in the ever-evolving world of cybersecurity.





The Appalachian Highlands Women's Business Center is the **only** WBC in Tennessee - one more economic development resource that puts Kingsport on the **map**!

The Appalachian Highlands Women's Business Center (AppH-WBC) became a program of your Kingsport Chamber in 2024, becoming one of 17 agencies across the country to receive a federal grant from the U.S. Small Business Administration Office of Women's Business Ownership. SBA Women's Business Centers (WBCs) are a part a national network of entrepreneurship centers throughout the United States and its territories, which are designed to assist women in starting and growing small businesses.

Headed by the Kingsport Office of Small Business Development and Entrepreneurship (KOSBE), the mission of the AppH-WBC is to serve women-owned small businesses and female entrepreneurs through one-on-one training and counseling, networking events and by connecting clients to the full array of SBA resources.

The vision of the AppH-WBC is to be the premier resource for women entrepreneurs and women-owned businesses in Northeast Tennessee by providing counseling and training services to equip women with access to capital and opportunities for government contracting. The AppH-WBC will serve the counties of Carter, Grainger, Greene, Hamblen, Hancock, Hawkins, Johnson, Sullivan, Unicoi and Washington.

Other locations that received the 2024 grant to open a WBC include: Pasadena, CA, Los Angeles, CA, Stamford, CT, Washington, D.C., North Miami, FL, Honolulu, HI, Chicago, IL, New Orleans, LA, Columbus, OH, Portland, OR, Barnwell, SC, Houston, TX, Norfolk, VA and Milwaukee, WI.

2024 AppH-WBC Highlights

- The AppH-WBC has established an Advisory Council.
- We obtained nearly 1,000 responses on the Women's Business Survey made in partnership with East Tennessee State University.
- The AppH-WBC has counseled 50 woman-owned businesses from our region.


